DRMA 230 : Directing I

Credits 5

Quarter Offered Winter

Students will develop a critical vocabulary and be introduced to a variety of contemporary perspectives about play direction. Students will work practically to develop their own ideas and style by directing three short, twoperson scenes with outside actors. Students will compete for spots in the spring Festival of Student-Directed One-Act Plays. This class may include students from multiple sections. (Elective)

Course Outcomes

Demonstrate a critical vocabulary to talk about direction.

Analyze a text for performative possibility.

Facilitate an interpretation of a text as a collaborative and performative artifact.

Explain contemporary theories of direction.

Explain acting from a directorial perspective.

Communicate objectives to student actors.

Articulate a personal theory of directorial leadership pertaining to issues of movement, motivation, trust, and creative freedom as it relates to actors and other collaborators.

Prepare an application to direct a one-act play in the Festival of Student-Directed, One-Act Plays on the PC main stage, Spring quarter.
