Included in the events are concerts by the PC Instrumental Jazz and Vocal Ensembles, poetry and prose readings, a special student art show in the PUB Art Gallery, and a Welding art show.

They also regularly attend conferences to learn more about the art of journalism, traveling to New York to tour and meet journalists at prestigious institutions such as The New York Times and The Wall Street Journal.

Cash prizes are awarded to first, second, and third place winners. All of the contributors are honored with a reception in the spring and give several readings in our local communities.

Numerous research and travel opportunities are available to our science students, who study and work in Keegan Hall, our Science and Technology building. Research opportunities abound on the Peninsula. Outstanding outdoor resources, such as Olympic National Park and state and national forests, encourage scientific inquiry and lead to exciting projects.
